### Armona Union Elementary School District

Armona is a community services district (not an official city) that lies midway between the cities of Hanford and Lemoore, the number 1 and 2 largest cities in Kings County. The Armona Union Elementary School District is roughly 45 square miles in mostly rural, farming country. As much as 65% of the students come from the four square miles that make up the “urban” part of the community. The east side of the district is partially in the City of Hanford boundary.

There are three schools within the district: Armona Elementary, Parkview Middle School and Crossroads Charter Academy. Armona Elementary is a K-4 school with 575 students. Parkview Middle School is a 5-8 middle school with 425 students and is in Program Improvement for the second year. Crossroads Charter Academy is a K-12 Virtual Independent Study program with a variation in size during the school year from 200-600 students. All schools follow a standards based curriculum.

### Mission
